First readings: Three selections from the book of Proverbs

Proverbs 17:17: A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity.

Second reading: John 15: 12-17

Jesus said to his disciples, ¹²“This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you *friends*, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷These things I command you, so that you will love one another.”

Interactive Homily: Let's talk more about friendship.

- What are some qualities that make someone a good friend?

- trust; loyalty; confidentiality; forgiveness; no gossip; listening; telling the truth; sticks with you through thick and thin; not taken for granted; not too busy; makes you laugh!
 - Think about the classic wedding vows [*start these and let people finish each phrase*]: “for better or ... for worse; for richer or ... for poorer; in sickness and ... in health; until death do us part.”
 - These are qualities of a friend, too—no matter what, they don’t jump ship and abandon you
- What makes a not-so-good friend?
 - Someone who is a bad influence; hot temper; easily offended; gossip; abandons you when the going gets tough (you may have heard the phrase “fair weather and foul weather friends”)
- Tell me about some friends you’ve had in your life. What were or are they like? What qualities did you most love about that person?
- Have you ever had a friend who lives far away, but when you see them you just pick up where you left off? What is that like?
- Why is God called our friend?
 - always with us; faithful to his promises; forgives, loves, guides
- How are we a friend to God?
 - love him; love one another; obey and follow no matter what

Let’s pray silently and thank God for the gift of friendship.

(Silent Prayer) ... Lord, hear our prayers. Now let us pray the Lord’s prayer together:

Lord’s Prayer: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever, Amen.

Third Reading: Aesop's Fable about Friendship¹
