



**Worship Service Theme: Loyalty**

**Welcome:** Welcome! It's so good to be together to celebrate faith and community. My name is \_\_\_\_ and I'll be leading our worship time today. Our theme for today is **loyalty**. What does loyalty mean to you? What does it mean when someone is loyal to you? (*Commitment; care for another no matter what.*) We'll talk together about what this means for our lives of faith.

Please pray with me as we open our time together.

**Opening Prayer:** Great and loving God, we ask your Holy Spirit to bless our time together and to refresh us with your presence. In the midst of a world full of trouble and strife, we thank you for watching over us, guiding us, and as we confess our sins, for forgiving us. Enable us to enter your presence today joyfully and reverently, and let us depart with the assurance that our sins are forgiven. Fill us, O God, with the peace which passes understanding. Amen.

**Opening Hymn: Doxology**

**Statement of Faith:** Let us affirm our statement of faith by reciting Psalm 23 together:

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

<sup>2</sup> He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

<sup>3</sup> He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

<sup>4</sup> Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

<sup>5</sup> Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.

**First Reading:** Ruth 1:6ff. This is a story from the Old Testament about an old widow and her two daughters-in-law. Here is what happened after the husbands of those daughters-in-law – the sons of the old widow – both died.

<sup>6</sup> Then Naomi [the woman whose husband and two sons had died] arose with her daughters-in-law to return from the country of Moab .... <sup>8</sup> and Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, “Go, return each of you to your mother’s house. May the Lord deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me.” Then Naomi kissed her daughters-in-law, and they lifted up their voices and wept. <sup>10</sup> And the daughters-in-law said to Naomi, “No, we will return with you to your people.” <sup>11</sup> But Naomi said, “Turn back, my daughters; why will you go with me? ... <sup>12</sup> Turn back, my daughters; go your way... <sup>14</sup> Then they lifted up their voices and wept again. And one daughter-in-law kissed Naomi goodbye, but the other daughter-in-law, named Ruth, clung to Naomi ... and said, “Do not urge me to leave you. For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God.” ...<sup>18</sup> And when Naomi saw that Ruth was determined to go with her, she said no more.

**Interactive Homily:** When we think about loyalty, I wonder what animal comes to mind? (*Refer to photos posted in the room, if using.*) What animal do we often describe as loyal, as “man’s best friend”? Dogs!

- I wonder why dogs are often called “man’s best friend”? What are dogs typically like?
  - Dogs *seek out* human company and interaction, unlike any other species on Earth.
  - Dogs love you no matter what!
- I wonder if anyone here had a dog while you were growing up? (*Show of hands.*) Do you have a dog story you could share with us? (*Ask people by name: “Tell me about your childhood dog...”*)
- Loyalty is certainly a trait that dogs have. What do you think it means to be loyal? What are the feelings and actions of loyalty?
  - Being true to something – a person, principle, actions; allegiance, faithfulness, steadfast devotion; *faithfulness*
- So we’ve heard about loyal dogs, but I wonder who has been the most loyal *person* in your life? Tell me more about that person – what made him or her loyal to you?
  - Family
  - Best friend (best man, maid of honor)
  - Spouses
  - Military partners
  - Work partners
- What about loyalty in the military service?
  - I wonder if anyone here knows the Marine Corps motto? “Semper fidelis,” always faithful. What does that kind of loyalty involve?
    - Loyalty to your fellow service men and women no matter what – even to death.

- What does it take for someone to be loyal? What do you need in your heart to be a loyal person, to stick with someone no matter what?
  - Is it always easy to be loyal? Nope ... so you need courage, especially in the face of opposition
  - Determination; when the going gets tough...
  - Promise keeping
  - Endurance
- In the Bible, God is most often described as having “*steadfast* love.” What does that mean to you, that God’s love is steadfast?
  - God’s love doesn’t come and go; it is steady and sure.
  - God *never* leaves us nor forsakes us, no matter what.
  - God’s loyalty to us, his faithfulness to us, is part of his nature. There is nothing we can do that would change God’s love for us!
- What does it mean that we are loyal to God?
  - We cling to God no matter what; return to God when we wander.

Let’s pray silently in thanks to God for loyalty in each other and especially God’s faithfulness to us.

**(Silent Prayer)** ... Lord, hear our prayers. Now let us pray the Lord’s prayer together:

**Lord’s Prayer:** Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever, Amen.

**Fourth Reading:** True stories of loyal dogs

In the 1920s, Hachiko, a golden brown dog, waited for his owner, a professor at the University of Tokyo, at the train station at the end of each day. Sadly, one day the professor did not return from school, where he had died suddenly. But for nearly nine years, Hachiko the dog kept going to the train station every morning and afternoon precisely when the train was due, patiently waiting for his beloved owner. Hachiko passed away peacefully on the street near Shibuya train station in 1935. In 2015, the University of Tokyo unveiled a new statue that shows the famous loyal dog happily reunited with his owner.

While on a family road trip, Bobbie, a 2-year-old Scotch Collie, got lost in the state of Indiana—but his family lived in Oregon. After six months of walking alone and traveling 2,800 miles, over two-thirds of the United States, the dog reunited with

his human family in Silverton, Oregon. Today in Silverton, you can find a replica of Bobbie's house and a statue in his honor.

On Sept. 11, 2001, Omar Eduardo Rivera, a blind computer technician, was working on the 71<sup>st</sup> floor of the World Trade Center with his guide dog, Salty. When a hijacked plane hit the tower and the building started to burn, Salty insisted that he and his owner leave, so they started down the escape staircase. It was slow going because the staircase was so crowded with people escaping. Omar wanted his dog to have a chance to live, so he unclipped Salty's leash and told him to go. Salty continued his way down, but a few minutes later Omar felt the dog nuzzling his legs—Salty had come right back to his side. "Salty decided, 'no, I cannot go without him,' so he came back," Rivera said. "He was telling me, 'I am with you. No matter what.'" Salty and a co-worker helped Omar climb down 70 flights of stairs, which took over hour. Soon after they all escaped the tower and survived. Omar says he owes his life to his faithful dog.
